## ABOUT THE COLLEGE:

Tengakhat College is situated in Tengakhat about 30 K.M. east of district HQ Dibrugarh and 17 K.M. West of Duliajan Oil Town. The college was established in 1967 at the initiative of a few eminent educationists and social workers of Tengakhat. The college was brought under the Deficit Grant-in-Aid system in 1986 and received UGC affiliation under 2 (f) and 12 (B) in 2007. The college was established with the objectives of imparting higher education for the students of the locality and surrounding villages and tea gardens. The college was accredited "Grade B" by NAAC in 1st cycle and accredited Grade B++ (CGPA 2.87) by NAAC in the 2nd cycle.

#### CONCEPT NOTE:

North East India is a homeland of more than 150 different communities based on geographical region, language, religion, caste and other factors. Since inceptions, these people have their own social and political systems. Based on geographical, topographical and religious systems they have varied economic systems. As a result, despite a single conglomerate they are varied within a single identity. In fact, plurality within one geographical identity is basic feature of the region.

Being varied in their ethno – cultural traits, they have experienced throughout ages different political systems. While in the plains the most powerful states, such as the kingdom of Pragjyotish-Kamrupa emerged in the remote past, in the hills organized political systems came slowly. These political and cultural deferences led to the emergence of descents of identity among the various communities either in their own localities or as a minority among the dominant sections. In the colonial period these differences became largely increased mainly due to their divide and rule policies. The identity questions became more apparent after the 19th century census activities, after the state reorganizations in the post independence period which shows the forces of separation and identity having marked their political life and culture.

Socially and ethnically the people of North East India have one single identity both imposed and emanated. Varieties of food, dress and beliefs & customs, living patterns, educational developments, agriculture, forestry & environment, literature and language have created the unique distinction of this region. Despite plurality and division, these people remain distinguish among the whole people of the country.

North East India despite being ethnically, environmentally, economically distinguished, it however maintains a deep and strong connectivity with the rest of the country and this connectivity has been always reflected on the basics of the culture, such as religion, philosophy, literature & language. Sankardeva, the great medieval reformer of Assam, appreciated openly that linkage and the benefits that could be derived by the people of this region from that deeply rooted connectivity.

The present seminar proposes to understand the political, social and cultural development of North East India in the context of that deeply rooted connectivity with Bharatavarsha on one hand and on the other hand on the basis of its own strength and weakness
